Musings from Pastor Mike

Pastoral Care – I am blessed to report that I am mentoring 5 young adults and one mature adult on a weekly basis. This mentoring process is related to discipleship, but is primarily a one-on-one Christian counseling and pouring in the love, encouragement, and guidance of God, with spiritual teaching being of secondary importance. It is more of an experiential, adoptive, relational investment that is related to discipleship but is different none the less. Mentoring in most cases is done by a more mature person acting as mentor, working with a less mature person as mentee. Pastor Carl Crouse, of Sumas C.C. Church, tells us that, “more than teachers, mentors are emancipators, freeing young Christians, freeing struggling people, freeing searching people from poor judgments, bad choices, clouded futures, and personal uncertainty, to gain a rich vision of life in Christ, health, joy, and peace.” The rewards of pouring into another person which the Lord has given you is just as rewarding to the mentor as it is to the mentee. I also enjoyed preaching on the Sunday just before New Year’s Eve with my message about encouraging ALL of us to make a resolution to become a mentor as well as a mentee for the year of 2013. Consider sharing your time with one who can benefit from your experience.

Young Adults Ministries – Converge Saturday evening get-togethers have taken on a new, fresh, updated look for 2013. On the first Saturday of the month we have dinner, an extravagant worship experience, and then dessert and fellowship. This worship is an hour or more long and is composed of much music, singing, prayer, and a full-length message. Emphasis is on including many young adult Christian musicians, artists, and prayer warriors from the metro area and is definitely an “invite your friends” evening. The second, third, and fourth Saturdays also start with a free, hot meal, but have a very short, acoustic worship with the emphasis for the evening being on Christian Education with a large group presentation, then breaking-out in small group discussions, with dessert and fellowship to follow. All Saturdays start at 6:00 PM and go to approximately 8:30 PM with child care available from 4:30 PM for the newly formed Kitchen Small Group that has a spiritual lesson or discussion while working as a team in the kitchen. Ralph Evangelista has put together a 5 minute film on our disaster relief trip to Joplin, MO. for the Presbytery of Detroit to place on their website. We will also try to get it placed on First’s website this month. He is also working on the POD Leadership Retreat that will be held at First in February. Praise God for working through our young adults!

Notes from our Parish Nurse

What if Grandpa Doesn't Have Alzheimer's

There's a condition that often masquerades as dementia, with one difference—it's treatable.

Jimmy Nowell of Clifton, Tex., had always been a top-notch salesman. Locals in search of auto parts knew he could get them exactly what they needed. But in 2000, when he was 59, Nowell's speech, along with his walking, started slowing. Sometimes he needed a cane. Later, he became disorganized, losing his train of thought or turning on the computer and freezing, not knowing what to do. In 2005, he lost his job as a result of his behavior. Still, Nowell and his wife, Ann, just chalked up the symptoms to old age.

Then in 2007, Nowell started blanking on Ann's name. In a panic, she dragged her husband to doctor after doctor, but no one could agree on a diagnosis. One specialist thought Nowell had Parkinson's disease; another said it was Alzheimer's. Finally, in 2009, Nowell's condition was correctly identified when a neurologist took an MRI and compared it to a baseline image taken a few years earlier: Nowell had normal pressure hydrocephalus (NPH), a condition that occurs when the clear fluid surrounding the brain fails to be reabsorbed, eventually leading to problems with memory, as well as bladder control and walking (one of the distinguishing signs is a disturbed gait). The symptoms creep up slowly at first—and when the condition is brought to a doctor's attention, it's often misdiagnosed.

"About 30 percent of my [NPH] patients were told they had Alzheimer's or Parkinson's," says Mark Luciano, M.D., neurosurgery director at Cleveland Clinic. "Sometimes they were told they were just getting old." As a result, it's tough to know how prevalent NPH truly is, but the Hydrocephalus Association estimates that at least 350,000 Americans—and 5 percent of people with dementia—have the condition. A 2005 Virginia Commonwealth University paper estimated that 9 percent of patients in assisted-living facilities may have NPH.

The good news is that unlike the vast majority of conditions that cause dementia, NPH can be treated by surgery to reduce pressure in the brain. The procedure is successful in 85 to 90 percent of NPH patients, as long as they have no complicating factors, like a spinal condition, says Michael Williams, M.D., director of Sinai Hospital's Adult Hydrocephalus Center in Baltimore.

For Nowell, news of a cure was welcome, but also frightening: A dime-size hole would be drilled into his skull and a shunt implanted to drain the excess fluid. Nevertheless, the Nowells decided to go forward with the surgery. Upon waking, Jimmy was able to walk without a cane for the first time in years. When his wife stepped off the elevator, he called out her name without hesitation, and she cried with joy. Jimmy was back.

...we want you to know about the grace that God gave the Macedonian churches. Out of the most severe trial, their overflowing joy and their extreme poverty welled up in rich generosity. 2 Corinthians 8:1, 2

How can a “most severe trial” lead to “overwhelming joy” and combine with “extreme poverty” to produce “rich generosity?” Paul credits God’s grace. This was a miracle by the power of God’s grace.

What is God’s grace? It is God’s favor – given to us unearned and unmerited because He loves us. It is active because He acts on those He favors. We are saved because He calls us by grace to faith in Christ. We mature in faith because He abides with us, and by grace He teaches and empowers us to fulfill the ministries He gives us. In Macedonia, His grace produced joy and rich generosity despite trial and poverty as the people pleaded for the privilege of sharing (2 Cor. 8:4). Grace can change hearts and increase worldly goods. Grace is powerful!

In the next chapter (9), Paul writes “God is able to make all grace abound in you...so you will abound in every good work” (9:8), and “he...will increase your store of seed and enlarge the harvest of your righteousness” (9:10), and “You will be made rich in every way so that you can be generous on every occasion” (9:11).

God’s grace equips us for ministry with spiritual gifts (Rom. 12:6-8; 1 Cor. 12: 1-11; Eph. 4:7-13). “Be strong in grace, to teach others” (2 Tim 2:1, 2), and, “Use whatever gift received to serve faithfully administering God’s grace” (1 Peter 4:10). Paul writes that “by the grace of God I am what I am,” (1 Cor. 15:10). Paul learned from God: “My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness” (2 Cor. 12:9). God’s grace is almost synonymous with the Holy Spirit. Stephen was both “full of the Holy Spirit” and “full of grace and power” (Acts 6:5, 8).

Abide with God knowing that He who saved you by grace to begin a good work in you will bring it to completion (Eph. 2:10; Phil 1:6) equipping you for whatever He calls you to do. ~John Holden
