







### **Adult Sunday School**

This winter we move into the rest of the **Sermon on the Mount**, beginning with an introduction on Jan. 5<sup>th</sup>. This will be a marvelous series, for it contains the essentials of Jesus' teachings. We will use both the Old Testament and the New Testament to help us understand what Jesus is saying and how we are to apply it. Join us in the North Parlor each Sunday at 9am. You will be blessed as you seek to increase your understanding of God's Word.

**FISH- Fellowship. Inspiration. Scripture. Hope.** FISH is our mid-week educational opportunity at FPCD. We meet at 6pm in Mitchell Hall for dinner. Then at 6:45 we go to our classes or to choir practice. Our adult class this winter will be "parables in reverse", an 8 week study of what the parables of Jesus look like today. This class will be led by Rev. Doug Campbell. We meet in the North Parlor.

**Hour of Excellence Short-term Reprisal-** At FISH, during January and February, we will have a guest speaker lead the adult class. Rev. Doug Campbell grew up in our church until his family moved out to Plymouth when he was 12. Doug came to faith while studying Art History in college. Later he attended Princeton Theological Seminary, where he met his wife Emily. They served as associate pastors in Scotland for 10 years and then Doug was called to work for the Scottish Bible Society.

Currently, Doug works as a consultant to national and international non-profits, helping them define who they are and how to fulfill their mission. He is also a part-time Interim Pastor in Livonia for the American Baptist Church. Doug and Emily have 2 delightful girls.

**Lenten Small Group Adventure-** The Christian Education Committee is asking each of our current small groups and some new ones to commit to meet for 6 weeks during Lent and focus on the study, "**You'll Get Through This**". 
It's a great time to start Sunday School! Your children are welcome to try it out any time. Our teachers are friendly, and it's a great group of kids!

## Youth Group Reaches Classmates with the Gospel



Last month the students reached out to classmates with the LifeBook provided by Gideons International. We teamed up with another youth group in Dearborn and handed out over 800 copies of the Gospel of John to friends! We also invited them to Dearborn Blast 2014 on January 3<sup>rd</sup>. This is our BIG kickoff party with another youth group in town. We hope to tell as many students as possible about the love of Christ and invite them to experience it themselves by coming to 4:12.

This month, in addition to Dearborn Blast 2014, we will have a lock-in on January 17 to teach the kids about the persecuted Church around the world. We will write letters to encourage real brothers and sisters in Christ imprisoned for their faith! We will also watch videos about life in hostile countries and fill help-packs to assist families who have had members killed or imprisoned. Please pray for God to move in the hearts of our youth to love Christ's church of all tribes, tongues and nations, and for the Holy Spirit to comfort those who are suffering.

Overall, 4:12 has grown by about 50% this year, with about 20 students involved. We have about 12 students attend 4:12 on a weekly basis. Please pray that our students will encounter the love of Jesus in a powerful way, and desire to share the gospel of salvation with their friends. I believe that God will use our boys and girls to radically transform the schools in the Dearborn area and reach dozens of other students for Christ! Please pray that God will bring this vision to reality this year. May God bless you and yours in 2014.

## Musings from Pastor Mike - January 2014

Leadership has always been a passion of mine. I have a Masters and Specialist Degree in Educational Leadership, taught 37 years in the public schools, was a Boy Scout badge counselor and soccer coach for over 14 years, worked as a Youth Minister (volunteer and paid staff member) for over 10 years, taught numerous adult and children's Sunday Education Hour classes (24 years), became a Lay Pastor (4 years) and Young Adult Ministries Director (over 2 years) right here at FPC. God has wired me to be the type of leader that author Bill Farrel has termed in his book, *The Ten Best Decisions that a Leader Can Make*", an "Accomplisher". Bill made me realize that I would be first to place a bumper sticker on my Transit that reads, "I am not bossy, I just have better ideas" (enough levity...or maybe true confessions!).

My passion for leadership development was recently ignited again when I read a story by author Henning Mankell in his book, "*The Art of Listening*". While on a mission trip in Africa, Henning heard two elderly African men in Mozambique exchange these words:

"I was visiting my friend at his home when he began to tell me this amazing story about something that happened to him when he was young. But it was a long story. Night came, and we decided that I should come back the next day to hear the rest. But when I arrived, he was dead." The other man pondered the conversation, and then finally spoke slowly, "That's not a good way to die – before you've told the end of your story."

The Holy Spirit has set a spark in me to ignite a passion of developing Christian Leaders to bring Him glory. One manifestation of this has been in the recent two-day training sessions of 11 mid-life adults to mentor young adults. I thank God for Val Evangelista, Keith Ingram, Bob Szczechura, Mike Barr, Sue Young, Ann Bleivik, Julia Casey, Jaeann Demuth, Cheryl Bear, and Brian Mayer for joining me on this journey. Ten of the mid-life adults already have been carefully matched up to young adults and we have begun this exciting journey of "living out life together". I also thank Jonathan Mallard for also going through this training with the possibility of young adults mentoring teens sometime down the road. I will offer up another adult mentoring class if the need becomes evident by mid-year and will offer to partner up with Jonathan when he accepts the challenge to offer up a class to young adults.

Likewise, Leadership development in young adults has prompted my team and me to move our "Converge Community" to Panera Cares. Keep us in prayer as our kick-off is January 4th and our year-long message will be on becoming effective *Servant Leaders*. We were able to move into the downtown area for the same budget that we have been spending with the advantage of evangelizing by our sheer presence right on Michigan Avenue. Check out my bulletin board outside our office to see a graphic, visual view of how the evenings will look like and how much freedom the young adults now have to live out the leadership message that I will give each Saturday. As a side note, **all of you, high school seniors, families, and the eldest members of our church family**, are invited to come to Panera Cares on Saturdays from 6-7:30 PM just to see and experience what we are doing, as well as purchasing a delicious meal that will benefit our venue.

**We are all leaders.** Some of us are wired that way by God and have leadership spelled out in our lives with a capital L. We have bumper stickers on our cars that read, "If I want your opinion, I will give it to you" (just teasing). Some are leaders with a lower-case L. That is, they have spiritual gifts that will enable them to share the gospel message as an influencer...much like salt subtlety flavors food. **You too are a leader and you have a story to finish.** God is fanning the spark in your heart to prepare you to become a blaze which will accomplish the Holy Spirit's purpose in you.

"Take delight in the Lord, and he will give you the desires of your heart. Commit your way to the Lord; trust in Him and he will do this: He will make your righteous reward shine like the dawn, your vindication like the noonday sun." - Psalm 37:4-6

My prayer for 2014 is that the Holy Spirit will direct us to become the Servant Leaders that God wants us to be, for the stated purpose of bringing him glory by "being and making disciples of Christ, who share God's word, seek his truth, and serve his world". Amen!

**Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows. James 1:17**

All the good things we have come from God. The words used express the act of giving, the gifts, and completeness. God's gifts are perfect, contrasting with temptations leading to sin and death (1:13-15).

What are these "good gifts? The next verse (1:18) says that God chose to make us the first fruits of Creation by a new birth through the word of truth. That is the greatest gift -- being reborn into eternal life. That prepares us to properly receive God's gifts and live with Him and each other forever.

Everything God created is good (*Genesis 1:31*). All things were created by and for Christ (*Col. 1:16*), which means everything has a good purpose. Through science (*Gen. 1:28*) and prayer, we are to discover those good uses and realize the blessings God has given us in His Creation. All things are to be received with thanksgiving consecrated by the word of God (*1 Tim. 4:4*). That means that God's gifts are sacred. Therefore, we are to share, thank God, and be good stewards of His Creation. We and all we have are His (*Psalm 24:1*). What do you have that you did not receive (*1 Cor. 4:7*)?

The "Father of heavenly lights" is not blocked the way clouds sometimes block the sun's light. God does not change (*Mal. 3:6*); He is always here with love, grace, providence, and glory, giving good and perfect gifts according to His good and perfect will. Therefore, give thanks with humility, and use His gifts wisely.

For those who have suffered a loss or who are going through a difficult time, life can be filled with painful loneliness and emptiness. If you are smiling on the outside, but full of pain on the inside and the joy you long for seems far away, help is available.
