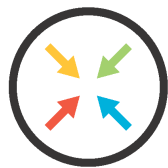

# Notes from our Parish Nurse

## Women and Cardiovascular Disease

More women die of cardiovascular disease than from the next four causes of death combined, including all forms of cancer. But 80 percent of cardiac events in women could be prevented if women made the right choices for their hearts involving diet, exercise and abstinence from smoking. Make it your mission to learn all you can about heart attacks and stroke — don't become a statistic. CALL 9-1-1

### **Heart Attack**

A heart attack occurs when the blood flow to a part of the heart is blocked, usually by a blood clot. If this clot cuts off the blood flow completely, the part of the heart muscle supplied by that artery begins to die.

#### **Signs of a Heart Attack:**

- Uncomfortable pressure, squeezing, fullness or pain in the center of your chest. It lasts more than a few minutes, or goes away and comes back.

- Pain or discomfort in one or both arms, the back, neck, jaw or stomach.

- Shortness of breath with or without chest discomfort.

- Other signs such as breaking out in a cold sweat, nausea or lightheadedness.

- As with men, women's most common heart attack symptom is chest pain or discomfort. But women are somewhat more likely than men to experience some of the other common symptoms, particularly shortness of breath, nausea/vomiting and back or jaw pain.

If you have any of these signs, don't wait more than five minutes before calling for help. Call 9-1-1...Get to a hospital right away.

### **Stroke**

Stroke is the No. 3 cause of death in America. It's also a major cause of severe, long-term disability. Stroke and TIA (transient ischemic attack) happen when a blood vessel feeding the brain gets clogged or bursts. The signs of a TIA are like a stroke, but usually last only a few minutes. If you have any of these signs, don't wait more than five minutes before calling for help.

Call 9-1-1 to get help fast if you have any of these, but remember that not all of these warning signs occur in every stroke.

#### **Signs of Stroke and TIAs**

- Sudden numbness or weakness of the face, arm or leg, especially on one side of the body

- Sudden confusion, trouble speaking or understanding

- Sudden trouble seeing in one or both eyes

- Sudden trouble walking, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination

- Sudden severe headache with no known cause

Also, check the time so you'll know when the first symptoms appeared. It's very important to take immediate action.

Research from the American Heart Association has shown that if given within three hours of the start of symptoms, a clot-busting drug can reduce long-term disability for the most common type of stroke.

### OUR QUIET TREASURE- THE TREASURE CHEST

A few years ago (quite a few!) a group of women from the church decided to start a fundraising activity for the church. They decided on a resale shop and the Treasure Chest was born. This shop is a place where you can bring your no-longer needed clothing, housewares, Christmas decorations, linens, furniture, shoes & boots, window treatments, and just about anything which is still useful with the exception of refrigerators, stoves, and televisions. We will take children's toys but we cannot sell them because that is no longer legal unless they are sterilized and checked for heavy metal contaminants. What we do is give them away for free. And, yes, we have tax vouchers. Because the items are priced very reasonably, our brothers and sisters out there who need some help can shop for needed items at a very small cost. The proceeds from this shop are used entirely for church projects. As an example, our elevator is one such project. The children's Christmas shopping venture is another. If you have not visited the shop, you will find us on the lower level at the end of the hallway next to the sanctuary every Wednesday from 10am to 4pm.

I think you will agree that this is a marvelous way of recycling, but it takes many hands to make it work. Our staff is dwindling due to relocation, death, or just not being able to do the work anymore. So we are asking for help. Do you have 2-3 hours a month that you can give? The working conditions are great and the result of your labor will be greatly appreciated by all those who shop with us. **Ministry** – I am thoroughly enjoying the challenges that Pastor Dave has and is offering me, so that I might grow as a CLP. From mid-January until late March, we will be working together to investigate the entire gospel of Mark. Pastor Dave is challenging both of us to preach, chapter by chapter, while relating each facet and “scene” of an individual chapter, into a tapestry of one sermon. Most of the time, pastors pick and choose, usually tying together two scenes at the most, or relating a scene with a personal story. John Mark’s source of information for his writing is the eyewitness account of the Apostle Peter, and Mark communicates it by using a writing style that captures the impulsive and action-oriented personality of Peter. Mark uses the “historic present” for events that took place in the past, to make his readers feel like these events are happening today, as well as make them feel like they are right there on the scene. I look forward to preaching and attempting to weave together an entire chapter in a way that best conveys Mark’s message to all of you.

**Are You Experiencing a "Winter" in Your Life?** In addition to the cold weather outside,



many people experience "winters" in their personal lives. A recent loss through death, divorce, or relocation may leave them feeling lonely. A hospitalization, cancer diagnosis, or ongoing medical problems may leave them feeling isolated. The loss of a job, the fear of layoffs, or a financial setback can devastate one's self-esteem.

**“Man shall not live by bread alone but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God.”**

*Matthew 4:4 (Deuteronomy 8:3)*

Our text is Jesus’ response to Satan’s first temptation. Satan tempted Jesus to transform stones into bread to reduce the pain of hunger from His forty day fast (*Matthew 4:2*). Jesus quoted Deuteronomy 8:3 where God let Israel experience hunger and then fed them manna so they might learn to trust Him for provision. Jesus knew God’s Word was a more significant source of sustenance than temporal food. Jesus’ stand against Satan’s temptations strengthened Him for His mission, and He was then sustained in God’s way by angels (*Matthew 4: 11; Psalm 91:11, 12*).

God directs our lives to bless us and make us more like Christ. *Proverbs 3:6* teaches that we are to acknowledge God in all our ways and He will make straight our paths. Satan tempts us to avoid the painful discipline of God’s lessons in this life. If we succumb to Satan, we waste life, forfeit blessings, and weaken our discipleship. Following God’s Word is our best defense against sinful temptations.
