

Contemporary Praise Music and Prayer Event



Musings from Pastor Mike - February 2014

Pastoral Duties as Lay Pastor: Praise God for all the opportunities that Pastor Dave and the Worship and Arts Team have given me to conduct worship and deliver multiple sermons this past month! I am really trying to improve the content of my sermons as I continue to work on the delivery and the “image” that will help our family of faith to be able to “brand” the message into their brain. Thanks to all of you for kind words & encouragement as well as suggestions that allow the congregation to connect with the spoken word. Ideas such as putting the Bible verses that I utilize in my messages on the screens, utilizing more youtube clips, and music that is relevant to the topic have been suggested by some of you and have already been incorporated into Saturday afternoons & Sunday mornings when I preach. Thanks church!

Pastor Dave and I will be doing a few sessions at the Presbytery of Detroit’s Leadership Saturday in February on conflict management. It’s always a pleasure to work with Pastor Dave who has such a lot of experience in pastoral counseling. I am also preparing to do a 2-day retreat with another pastor in the Presbytery in which we will be presenting conflict management to “pastors in transition” up in Dewitt, Michigan. God is good!

I was able to take 3 days from my usual schedule to attend Calvin College’s Symposium Worship Conference. This is the best way for me to get re-energized each year in my preaching and leading of worship, as well as get some new ideas from “world-class” speakers and presenters.

Notes from our Parish Nurse

With the increased stressors in our everyday lives, it is not a wonder that our blood pressure levels are shooting through the roof! Did you know that in the US alone, over 50 million people have increased blood pressure levels, 62% of which are associated with attributable risk factor for heart attack and stroke. Despite these statistics, less than 60% of individuals with known high blood pressure receive any treatment, and of those, only one third achieve adequate control.

Now, new research published by Charles DeCarli in *Lancet Neurology* aids in the push towards greater awareness of blood pressure levels even amongst the healthy middle-aged population. DeCarli and his team found similar accelerated brain aging images in both young middle-aged people with high blood pressure compared to those whose blood pressure levels weren't really consider very high (pre-hypertensive).

In the study that DeCarli and his team examined, there were almost 600 individuals who took part in this study over the course of 60 years. Most of these subjects were in their middle-30s when the research began. The subjects had their blood pressures taken and then were placed in one of three categories: normal blood pressure, pre-hypertensive and hypertensive. In addition, they were given a magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) scans to measure any white matter injury and gray matter atrophy in the brain. (White matter in the brain helps to speed conduction of messages, helps neurons get nutrition and protects the brain from infection. Gray matter helps you perform conscious thoughts and sense your environment and coordinate movements). When these brain imaging measurements were combined, a global measure was produced that allowed for the comparison of brain health among different blood pressure groups.

Surprisingly, the researchers found that the brains of 30-year-olds with high blood pressure looked similar to the brains of people in their 40s who had normal blood pressure. They summarized that systolic blood pressure (the top number of BP which indicates pressure of blood when the heart beats) was associated with injury to white matter microstructure and regional grey matter in healthy young adults. Furthermore, injury worsened continuously as blood pressure increased and was significantly different between normotensive and pre-hypertensive subjects in some anatomical regions. Most importantly, these anatomical differences exhibited in subjects at fairly young ages were similar to the abnormal distributions seen within high blood pressure subjects later in life. The authors suggested that high blood pressure impedes the blood flow, and thus reduces the supply of oxygen and essential nutrients to the receiving axons. And while they didn't determine the exact amount of pressure that causes brain aging and cognitive/memory problems, they did theorize that elevated pressures significantly affect them.

The authors concluded that their "results emphasized the need for optimum control of blood pressure", which is best done by increasing awareness and stressing the importance for regular monitoring for adverse blood pressure levels, in order to promote healthy brain aging.

But just as He who called you is holy, so be holy in all you do; for it is written: "Be holy, because I am holy." *1 Peter 1:15, 16; Lev 20:7*

God is holy, and He calls us to be holy. What does that mean, and how can we become holy?

Holiness means belonging to God (*Eph. 1:4, 5; Rom. 8:29, 30*) being consecrated, purified, and set apart for His service. That means we become totally conformed to His will (*Rom. 6:19, 22, 23; Titus 1:8*).

Jesus' life on Earth displayed holiness. He taught God's demand for holiness, and He lived as He taught.

Holiness is an attribute of God required of His people, yet here on Earth, only God is holy (*Mark 10:18; Ex. 15:11; 1 Sam. 2:2; Rom. 3:23; Rev. 15:4*). God's expectation for His people reflects His own nature: "You shall be to me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation" (*Ex. 19:6; 1 Peter 2:9*). Without holiness, no one will see the Lord (*Heb. 12:14*). Without holiness, we cannot approach God. How can sinners like us become holy?

Salvation in Christ leads to holiness, beginning when we receive Christ (*John 1:12, 13*) and are born again (*John 3:3-8; 2 Cor. 5:17-21*). As disciples, God re-makes us into Christ's likeness (*Rom. 8:28-31*). This comes gradually through obedience, service, and trials assisted by prayer and perseverance (*John 16:33; Rom. 5:3; 1 Cor. 1:30, 31; 2 Cor. 7:1; Eph. 4:22 - 24; Phil. 1:6; Col 3:1-4:6; 2 Tim 3:12; Hebr. 12:3-11; James 1: 2-8*). Our holiness is certain because Jesus paid for our sins on the Cross, leaving no sin to condemn us at Judgment. God then makes us holy, giving us His gift of eternal life in His family.

All is of God; thank God for His grace which we can receive by faith, not merit!
