March at FPCD

It is with some sense of nostalgia that I send Jim Barber - our Vision Editor and publisher –this last missive from the Pastor's Desk. As I look back over my past 57 years of service to the PCUSA it is, of course, to FPCD that most memories recur. From the days of 2,500 members and worship services dubbed "Spartacus events," to our current 388 members - yet with similar feelings of awe in the beauty of holiness. The great span of the Sanctuary - singular stately Celtic Cross, (fashioned together with the entire facility by Alden Dow to express our Reformed Trinitarian Faith)- to the green carpeting carrying the worshipper to the green grass beyond- through the glass windows. Who is not moved when the magnificent organ initiates our worship experience?

Having worked with two editors of our church history - Ms. Kathleen Parr and Mrs. Bill (Dottie) Kennedy - utilizing the small horde of remembrances to remind us of the history of this great Church and her people - who cannot be humbled by the thousands of good folk who have called this church - "my spiritual home."

It has been my great privilege to have served this people on three occasions. Once, in her early years, and now twice in the last decade. God is great - God is good! Let us thank him! So it was that our new Pastor Chris Thomas opined on Sunday, as he was elected to serve as the Senior Pastor of FPCD. With an appropriate introduction by PNC chairperson Mike Barr, Pastor Chris brought his message and a glimpse of his vision in serving this family. I'm still musing over the "low expectations" re: marriage. For those who were not able to be with us on Sunday please take the time to check out the web site and his sermon.

We owe a great debt of gratitude to the PNC - Mike Barr, Jane Dearth, Bert Ebi, Shereen Lind, Jan Lewy-Mykytenko, Bob Missler and Jan Smith. For over a year they poured over more than 200 personal information forms- conducted interviews with 21 candidates- with second interviews with several. Once each week they would meet - review - pray - seek - and finally have found the one they believe that God has brought to serve us. Thank You - and your families for their patience. On Sunday our Church family concurred in your decision.

Sunday, February 28th will be my last Sunday in the pulpit before Pastor Chris begins his service on March 6th. We still must take time to prepare for his arrival. As you all know the church is facing a financial challenge that must be addressed. For a decade or more we have been supported by funds from our endowment fund - and, our undesignated holding account. As each year passed the challenge has become greater. Thanks to the generous response to the special fund campaign in 2014 we were able to meet needs, but not without a deficit. In order to provide our new pastor with a balanced budget in 2017 we will need to make some changes. For this past decade the Session has studied and made recommendations - for the last year this has been in earnest. It is part of my duty as your temporary pastor - and, pastor emeritus – on behalf of the Session - to bring those final recommendations to the congregation. A "state of the church" report will be delivered following worship on February 28th. I urge you to attend and be made aware of the issues and the way in which your Session has decided to respond.

Sunday Night Bible Discussion Group

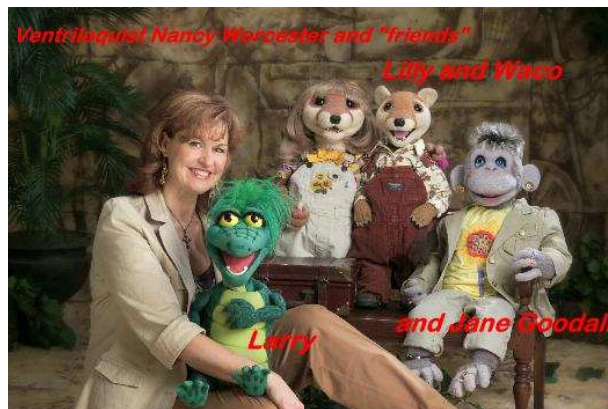

Musings from Pastor Mike, CRE

Young Adult & Adult CE Director and Youth Groups Leader

Recently I took my two Youth Groups ice skating at Dearborn's DISC indoor rink for an every-other-month "Funday Sunday". We had a great turn out and even had a dad, Phil Evenhouse come along. He was a great help, as an accomplished skater, to be able to give the teens (as well as 5, young adult internationals from Converge) many tips about skating. This was a blessing as some of the teens and all of the young adults from India had never been on ice skates or on a huge arena of ice. As I was skating and assisting those that lacked confidence and experience, I sensed the relationship skating had to the first beatitude that Jesus shared in his sermon on the mount (you see, that's part of my current calling as a pastor J).

"Blessed are the poor in Spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven"

The visual metaphor that I had was how that **joy and hope are ice-skating with God at our side.**



In other words, the first beatitude can be unpacked by stating that: "followers of Jesus Christ will experience joy and hope when they realize that God can overcome any obstacle in their or another's life. Now, it may be in a different way from what you had imagined or in a time-frame other than what that you desired. God may also direct you to actively participate in a particular way that the Holy Spirit leads. By knowing this and being obedient to God's directions, you will begin to transform into the person that God has destined you to become." How exciting it is to finally discover how your life lines up with a need in the world, what your purpose is, and how God is next to you to keep you from slipping and failing to learn a new skill.

Preventive Health Screenings coming to First Presbyterian Church March 21st

Life Line Screening will be offering preventive health screenings on Monday, March 21, 2016. As part of the screening event, Life Line Screening will offer *low-cost* take-home colorectal cancer tests called FIT (Fecal Immunochemical Test) in recognition of March as Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month. These tests are simple, accurate, and recommended for the early detection of colorectal cancer. According to the Centers for Disease Control, the risk of developing colorectal cancer increases with age. More than 90% of cases occur in people aged 50 and older.

Other preventive screenings provided check for stroke risk, abdominal aortic aneurysms, and osteoporosis. First Presbyterian Church of Dearborn is pleased to make these important screenings available by hosting Life Line Screening, the nation's leading provider of preventive health screenings.

Screenings are fast, painless and affordable. Three key tests check for blocked carotid arteries, an irregular heart rhythm called atrial fibrillation, and high blood pressure, which are the three leading risk factors for stroke. Strokes are the third leading cause of death in the U.S., yet, with preventive strategies, 80% of strokes can be prevented.

Other tests check for abdominal aortic aneurysms and hardening of the arteries in the legs. A bone density screening to assess osteoporosis risk is also offered and is appropriate for both men and women. Many events also offer blood tests, including cholesterol, glucose and c-reactive protein screenings.

Screening packages start at \$139. Single tests cost around \$70. **By signing up for this health event, not only will you be able to take your health into your own hands, but you will also receive \$10 off any package of \$139 or more.**

What is peace? The Hebrew word "shalom" means not just the absence of conflict; it includes everything that makes for man's highest good. This allows enjoying a fulfilled life. It includes the "peace which passes all understanding" (Phil. 4:7), which can guard you. True peace is a great blessing!

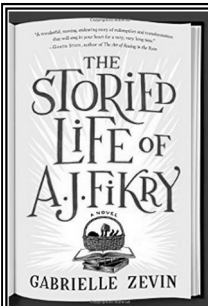
Making peace is Godly work. "Children of God" refers to people doing Godly work. Those who actively work to build peaceful human relationships reflect God's character. Peace is a fruit of the Spirit (Gal.5:22) that encourages love for all (Col. 3:12-17). Peace makers often possess the characteristics of the first six Beatitudes (spiritual poverty, mourning, meekness, righteousness, mercy, and purity (Matt. 5:3 – 8).

Peace-making is costly and difficult because of sin. The Christian life often conflicts with culture (Matt. 10:34; 2 Tim. 3:12). Biblical peace comes from dealing with issues in a Godly manner, not evading them. Forgiveness is an important part of peace-making (Matt. 6:12; 18:21-22; Rom. 12:17-21).

Making peace precedes worship (Matt. 5:23, 24). Perfect peace comes from focusing our minds on God (Is. 26:3; Rom. 8:6). God brings peace through the Gospel (1 John 1:9); following Jesus helps us find peace (John 16:33).

We have peace with God when we are justified by faith in Christ (Rom. 5:1). We are called to the ministry of reconciliation (2 Cor.5:17-21). There is no peace for the wicked (Is.48:22).
