

Memorial Day Reflection



“... In 1990 when I was chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, I took my Soviet counterpart, Gen. Mikhail Moiseyev, around the United States. I wanted to give him a better understanding of what America is all about.

We started in Washington D.C. (after showing him the Jefferson and Lincoln Memorials)... I was ready to take him to the Vietnam memorial. I showed the general how to find someone's name on it. I looked up Maj. Tony Mavroudis. Tony and I had grown up together on the streets of New York. We went to college together. We became infantrymen together. And in 1967, on his second tour of duty in Vietnam, Tony was killed... It was an emotional moment for me, and not just for me. Gen. Moiseyev reached out gently and touched the wall. The infantryman in him understood...

... take time to honor our fellow Americans who gave their last full measure of devotion to our country and for the freedoms we cherish.”

Do not let this Book of the Law depart from your mouth; meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do everything written in it. Then you will be prosperous and successful.

Joshua 1:8

God called Joshua to lead Israel into the Promised Land. God was with him (v.9), but to succeed, he was to continually meditate on God's Word. To succeed, so must we (*Psalms 1:2; 119:97, 148*). Why is meditation on God's Word so important and often difficult?

You and I already meditate, and it shapes us. Unfortunately, mediation on worldly issues (*1 John 2:15 – 17*) can distance us from God by making us more worldly. We need to meditate on God's Word to live by faith. Jesus resisted temptation by following Deut. 8:3 (which He knew intimately): "man does not live on bread alone but on every word that comes from the mouth of God." (*Matt. 4:4*). As bread helps our temporary body, so the Word of God helps our eternal soul. Contemplating on God's Word helps us personalize and understand God's truth so we can better live by faith in our daily lives and be blessed.

God's Word acts as a sharp and active two-edged sword that penetrates, separates, and divides (*Hebr. 4:12*). Reflecting on Scripture helps us accept the discomfort of cutting out bad habits and attitudes so we can better experience our spiritual life.

Christ cleanses the church by washing with water through the Word to make her radiant, without stain or blemish, but holy and blameless (*Eph. 5:26, 27*). Meditating on God's Word helps Him expose our sin and energize our repentance from it, liberating us for spiritual growth and blessings. Read the Bible reflectively, pray about it, and listen to God. Let God's Word guide and bless our lives. ~John Holden


'Farewell' from Glenn Maggard and Lisa Holt
