Adult Summer Sunday School – The Exodus

Emergency Response Plan Task Force

We have been hard at work gathering information on how best to secure our building and create a safe environment for all of the groups that use the building during the week. We had Brad Smith from the Dearborn Fire Department and Rob Seeley from the Dearborn Police Department share their wisdom and expertise with many of us on Tues. June 4th. Then the Task Force shared the same information with many others on Thurs. June 13th.

We have taken their suggestions and are creating a comprehensive plan that hopefully will be ready to share with the congregation at the end of August and during the month of September. We will meet with every group during that time to share how they can best respond to various emergencies that might occur while they are in the building.

We will hold training for ushers, teachers, leaders in dealing with medical emergencies, weather issues, building evacuations, disruptive visitors, and those with harmful intent.

Changes that are already in progress include:

- Heavy duty bolts on doors to keep those in the rooms safe
- Window in the office doors to protect the staff
- Evacuation maps in every room of the building
- Creating a silent communication system between classrooms, the office and the narthex area
- Developing a more cautious climate by all, when the building is unlocked.

Educating the congregation and the user groups will come in the form of newsletter articles, minute for missions in worship, and visits to explain the plan with each user group in the fall.

As part of this process, we plan to hold a fire drill at the end of worship on Sunday, September 15th, in order that everyone will know what to do in case we ever need to evacuate the building. If weather is an issue on the 15th, the fire drill will be held on Sunday, September 22nd. More information will be forthcoming over the next couple of months.

Well, we're in the summer, and I'm already planning for the fall. As part of my planning for the year, I look at composers' anniversaries, and other anniversaries that might help me to plan music for the coming year. This year there were several that caught my eye.

- ◆ 50 years ago: The assassination of John Fitzgerald Kennedy, the death of C.S. Lewis, the death of composers Francis Poulenc and Paul Hindemith.
- ◆ 100 years ago: The birth of composers Norman Dello Joio, Witold Lutoslawski and Benjamin Britten.
- ◆ 200 years ago: The birth of composers Giuseppe Verdi and Richard Wagner.
- ◆ 1000 years ago: The birth of composer Hermannus of Richenau.

Now we won't do anthems by all of these composers, but it helps to ground my music choices to review historically where the Church has been in its history. The fact that composers as far apart as Hermannus of Richenau, Giuseppe Verdi and Benjamin Britten wrote music to the same scriptural texts is both amazing and humbling.

Musings from Pastor Mike - July 2013

GrouPeru! 13 – Our mission team had a successful 2 week trip once again to share God's love with those rescued street boys and public school kids who live below the equator. Thank-you again to the great family of faith at First Church Dearborn for allowing us to be representatives of this outwardly-focused church to our Peruvian brothers and sisters. We did much more work in public schools this year during the day, traveling from classroom to classroom singing Christian songs with the kids, presenting a short biblical drama, and of course, the ever popular crafts! In the evenings, we spent time with the boys playing soccer, doing artsy things, and being big brothers and sisters to those who once lived homeless in the alleys and sewers of urban centers. We take seriously the command by Jesus to carry out the Great Commission and are thankful to you for allowing us to be a part of this ministry.

Pastoral Duties – While 95% of my ministry here at FPC is to be spent concentrated on the young adults, I am also thankful for the opportunities to occasionally preach, compose and recite pastoral prayers, and be a part of crafting worship services. July 7th the Peru Team will conduct worship, August 4th I get to preach and serve the Lord's Supper, and September 1st the Young Adults will conduct worship. It is a treat to be a small part of the worship team that puts so much effort into bringing glory and honor to God.

Converge – Wow! These young adults are amazing! Last month 13 individuals spent an entire Saturday (8 AM-5 PM) working at the House of Hope Community Center/Church in Detroit planting a neighborhood vegetable garden, painting out urban blight, planting flowers and cutting a lawn to create a welcome entryway into the neighborhood, reclaiming a street whose curbs were covered up under years of old leaves and debris, trimming a forest full of trees, repairing the physical plant that houses the community center, and enjoying fellowship with over 50 other Christian volunteers. In June we also sent 3 of us to work with 30 others from the Presbytery of Detroit to NJ to help with the rebuilding of Pleasant Point Beach that was devastated by Hurricane Sandy just over a year ago. The pastor at the Presbyterian Church that housed us predicts that it will take over 10 years to totally rebuild the town. Near the end of this month we will host an event in Cass Park in Detroit that will feed, clothe, and offer free health checks and referrals for treatment to 150 individuals who call the Cass Corridor home. Thank-you to all of you who have been so generous in hiring young adults (Converge Landscaping Services) to do various yard work and plantings. You have offered up employment opportunities to at least 5 individuals and have been most generous, often paying more than what was earned. You are teaching the young adults of this church what extravagant giving is all about. May God bless you all as you enjoy the remainder of the summer and be sure to mark Saturday, August 10th from 6-10 PM on your calendar as the date of the *Community Corn-Roast Concert* that will be held out-doors on the church grounds. See you in worship!

Notes from our Parish Nurse

Do you have High Blood Pressure???

Who is at risk for high blood pressure?

About 65 million American adults—nearly one in three—have high blood pressure. In the United States, high blood pressure occurs more often in African Americans than in Caucasians.

Many people get high blood pressure as they get older. Over half of all Americans aged 60 and older have high blood pressure. This is **not** a part of healthy aging. There are things you can do to help keep your blood pressure normal, such as eating a healthy diet, maintaining a healthy weight, and getting enough physical activity.

Your chances of developing high blood pressure are also higher if you:

- Are overweight

- Are a man over the age of 45

- Are a woman over the age of 55

- Have a family history of high blood pressure

- Have pre-hypertension (that is, blood pressure in the 120–139/80–89 mmHg range)

Other things that can raise blood pressure include:

- Eating too much salt

- Drinking too much alcohol

- Not getting enough potassium in your diet

- Not doing enough physical activity

- Taking certain medicines

- Having long-lasting stress

- Smoking (smoking can cause a temporary rise in blood pressure)

What is high blood pressure and what are the signs and symptoms?

Blood pressure is the force of blood as it moves through the blood vessels. If blood cannot flow easily through the vessels, the force increases. If the force is too great, you have high blood pressure.

High blood pressure is called the **silent killer** because you can have it for years without knowing it. The only way to find out if you have high blood pressure is to have your blood pressure measured. Using a blood pressure cuff and stethoscope or electronic sensor, you or your doctor/nurse can take your blood pressure and tell you if it is high. Even though high blood pressure usually has no signs or symptoms, it is dangerous if it continues over time.

High blood pressure is a serious disease. It can lead to heart disease, stroke or kidney problems. It is important to find out whether you have high blood pressure and, if you do, how to keep it under control. For this reason, the Health Ministry at First Presbyterian Church will be instituting **Blood Pressure Screenings twice a month (2nd and 4th Sundays) beginning 30 minutes before the start of the 10 am church service.** We will be rotating skilled personnel to take your BP and recommend follow-up with your physician if it is elevated.



For this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found. So they began to celebrate. *Luke 15, verse 24*

This text from Jesus' parable of the Prodigal (*Luke 15:11-31*) is the Father rejoicing at the return of His wayward son. The Father received His son lovingly because He had been looking for his return and was filled with compassion (v.20). The Father did this despite His son's selfishness, rejection, and unwise behavior.

The son had asked for his share of the Father's estate so he could leave home to go to the far country. Inheritances normally come after death. This son did not like living at home with his Father and would not wait; he wanted money now to get away. His Father gave him the money; he left, and then squandered the money with wild living (v.13). A famine hit, and he was broke, barely surviving by feeding pigs (v.15).

In pain with humility, the son "came to his senses" (v.17) and compared his situation with that of his Father's servants. With sorrow for his sins, he returned to his Father to confess, repent, and accept whatever his Father might do to him. His Father had been longingly waiting for him, and received him with love, compassion, and such joy that He celebrated the event publicly. Read *Luke 15:11-24*.

God loves sinners, and welcomes them warmly when they repent and turn to Him, no matter how much they have sinned. God's love and forgiveness in Christ can save and restore the worst of sinners; we cannot sin so devastatingly that God's compassion in Christ cannot forgive and restore us into His family. Therefore, when we "come to our senses," and repent, God will forgive us with joy and welcome us into His eternal presence. God's compassion and grace to sinners is beyond our comprehension (*Exodus 34:5-7; Nehemiah 9:16 – 21; Psalm 103:8 – 18; and 1 John 1:9*).

You can always enjoy the love and forgiveness of God if you repent. Remember David (*2 Sam. 12:13, 14; Ps. 32:1-5*).

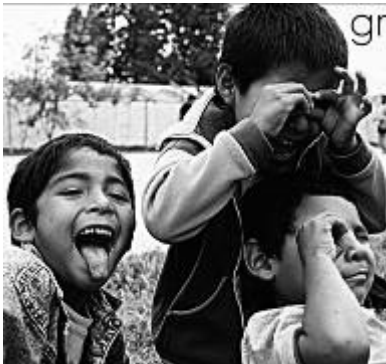
