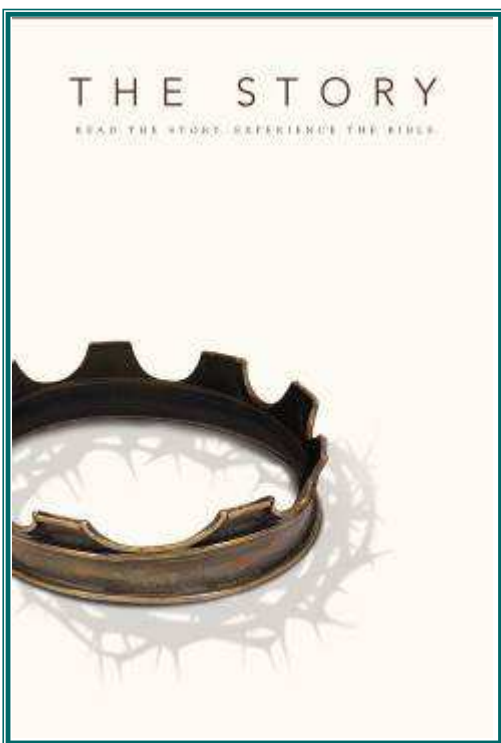

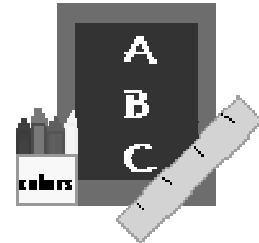
I hope that we see YOU at one of these musical opportunities. We also have opportunities for solos and other special music. Please see me if you are interested.

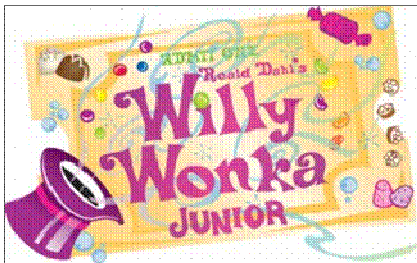
Presbyterian Women's Bible Study

Notes from our Parish Nurse

August is National Cataract Awareness Month

“Learn to recognize the most common cause of blindness in the world”

According to the American Academy of Ophthalmology, cataracts are the leading cause of visual loss in Americans 65 and older. Nearly half of adults by age 80 will develop cataracts, or clouding of the lens. This month, learn how to recognize the symptoms, find treatment, and educate others on this common (but treatable) eye condition.

What is a cataract? A cataract is a clouding of the lens in the eye, the part of the eye that focuses light and produces clear images. Inside the eye, the lens is contained in a sealed bag or capsule. As old cells die they become trapped within the capsule. Over time, more cells die and accumulate, causing the lens to cloud, making images look blurred or fuzzy. For most people, cataracts are a natural result of aging. But, eye injuries, certain medications, and diseases such as diabetes and alcoholism have also been known to cause cataracts.

In the early stages, stronger lighting and eyeglasses may lessen vision problems caused by cataracts. As a certain point, however, surgery may be needed to improve vision. Cataract surgery is the most frequent performed surgery in the United States. More than 90% of the people who have cataract surgery regain useful vision.

Symptoms:

- clouded or blurry vision	- sensitivity to light, both nighttime & daylight
- fading colors	- difficulty reading
- double vision	- frequent changes in eyeglasses prescription

Treatment: For smaller cataracts, the first steps of treatment include changes in your prescription of eyewear, using a magnifying lens, or increasing your lighting. As the condition progresses, surgery is the most effective treatment. During the surgery, the ophthalmologist removes the clouded lens from the front of your eye through a small incision and replaces it with a new one.

Aftercare: After surgery, you will generally be allowed to go home, but you cannot drive. You may be prescribed eye drops or pills to help control pressure in the eye and encourage healing. And an eye shield or eyeglasses will be worn to help protect the eye. Try to avoid rubbing the affected eye, and avoid heavy lifting or bending, as this increases the pressure in the eye. You will have several follow-up visits with your ophthalmologist to track the progress of your vision.

Prevention:

- Wear proper eye protection in the sun; use UV blocking sunglasses (worn anytime you are exposed to the sun's rays).
- The American Academy of Ophthalmologists recommends eating a diet rich in antioxidants such as spinach, broccoli, and eggs.
- Some studies also suggest Vitamin C and E supplements may help to decrease your risk of developing cataracts.

It is vital that you receive regular checkups with your eye doctor, especially after age 40 to help diagnose cataracts and other common eye problems early.

As the rain and the snow come down from heaven, and do not return without watering the earth...so is my word that goes out from my mouth; it will not return to me empty, but will accomplish what I desire and achieve the purpose for which I sent it. *Isaiah 55:10, 11*

The Bible comes from God, like the rain and snow, for His purposes, which He will achieve. As the rain and snow give us water and living plants, so God's Word leads us toward truth and a spiritual life. God's Word is active; when He speaks, things happen (*Jer. 23:29*). He uses His Word to change us.

How are we changed? God wants us to know Him (*John 17:3*). Our new birth comes through His Word (*1 Peter 1:23*), so we can know Him. People changed by God's Word are blessed (*Psalms 1*). God's Word prepares us for salvation and good work (*2 Timothy 3:15 to 17*) as He works in our lives (*1 Thess. 2:13*). God's Word provides numerous benefits (*Psalms 119*).

The Bible is God-breathed, not man-made (*2 Peter 1:20, 21; Daniel 12:8-10*), though the Holy Spirit used humans to scribe it. God's verbal revelation is miraculous, which is why there is no other book like it.

God's Word stands forever (*Is 40:8; 1 Peter 1:25*). It is the eternal truth (*John 17:17*) that Jesus came to proclaim (*John 18:37*). Some people accept a 'relative' truth (what may be true for you might not be true for me; so we can each have our own truth without universal absolutes). God's Word teaches absolute truth (the truth claim must be consistent with what is real). God's Word is True truth, so the Bible is our primary guide for life and worship.

Do you seek the truth? Do you want more of God in your life? Study God's Word. The Godly man's delight is in the law of the Lord, and on His law he meditates day and night... Whatever he does prospers (*Psalms 1*).
