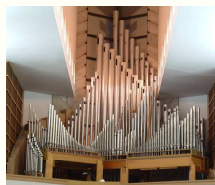

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

Rally Day

Our new programmatic year begins Sept 8, 2013, **Rally Day**. We will begin the day with a light breakfast in Mitchell Hall at 9am. We will introduce the teachers/leaders for this fall's classes and give you a brief description of the classes.

All of our Sunday morning classes will be focusing on the Beatitudes this fall, following the same theme/schedule as the morning worship services.

Come and kick off the year with a wonderful morning.

Sunday Morning Adult Class

We will offer one large class this fall, **To Be a Blessing**. Using the Beatitudes as found in Matthew 5, we will explore what it means to be a disciple of Jesus Christ and how we are to live in Him. True disciples of our Lord are blessed and can then become a blessing to others, our church, our community, and our world. This study in discipleship will help each of us grow in our relationships with the Lord and with others and will then help each of us be able to share His gospel and serve others more effectively.

Join us on Rally Day at 9am in Mitchell Hall as we introduce this study. We will have a schedule available for all.

FISH

FISH, our weekly Wednesday evening educational opportunity, begins on Sept. 11th. Dinner will be at 6pm, followed by classes at 6:45 til 8:00. Our adult class will be **Who Do You Think That You Are? – Finding Your Identity in Christ**, led by Mike Hoffman. This Mark Driscoll video series explores what it means to be children of God, made in His image, and defined by His view of us.

A second adult class will be offered this fall – **Grief Share**. Led by Parish Nurse, Chris Mayer, this class helps those who have lost a loved one find comfort in sharing with others who are also grieving. Please see Chris for more information.

We do not want parents going upstairs to get their children, putting themselves at risk. By the time parents could get upstairs, the children will have already evacuated the building.

This fire drill is part of our Emergency Response Plan, helping all of us be better prepared to deal with emergencies in our building that may arise. Thank you for your cooperation!

Musings from Pastor Mike - September 2013

Pastoral Duties: I was blessed to be able to preach twice in August and help prepare the Young Adults for planning/writing/running the entire worship service on September 1st. We all have been stretched in a number of ways and continue to grow and transform as teachers, preachers, artists, musicians, speakers, and writers. Holding to the truth, but speaking it in love, seems to be the most challenging action that many who are passionate about their faith have to develop and mature in. I pray that the Holy Spirit keeps working in us all to use our spiritual gifts as God spoke through Paul in 1 Corinthians 13:1-13. I continue to mentor 3 young men who are growing in maturity on a weekly basis and am developing a mentoring program to help train others to be able to utilize this valuable skill.

Young Adult Ministries: We have finally finished tweaking the calendar for Converge Young Adult Ministries. We have a number of new, educational, Christian video kits ordered that are taught by the nation's most influential and theologically sound young pastors. Converge will spend 3 weeks a month utilizing these new kits and one weekend a month doing missional activities at church, in Detroit, out-of-state, and of course, our international GrouPeru! Mission trip. We are working to integrate ourselves into the events of FPC (such as ChristNet, Noel, Community Corn & Brat Roast Concert) as well as other local Christian-based activities. We thank Laura Mallard for her stint as Converge cook and wish her well in her new, full-time job as teacher, as we welcome "Converge regular" Georganne Semeniuk as cook-in-training. To be financially sound, we have reduced meals and cooking salary to twice a month with once a month being a "cook-off" supplied by Converge attendees, and once a month a missional activity off-site that all will chip-in, as they are able, for Hot & Ready pizzas. Converge Landscaping activities have wound-down for this year, as most everyone is gainfully employed, praise God! My office-buddy Jonathan continues to hone Converge's Discipleship Program using small groups, Bible Studies and one-on-ones (see his article for more details).

Fish and Sunday Morning Education: You will see me offering more classes to adults of ALL ages. I plan to teach Mark Driscoll's *Who Do You Think That You Are? – Finding Your Identity in Christ* video/discussion format at FISH and have developed a Sunday morning class that will focus on the Beatitudes, Essential Truths of the Christian Faith (R.C. Sproul), and special topics. This Sunday morning class will be for H.S. Seniors, Young Adults, and members of Session to promote a healthy exchange of discussion as well as inter-generational fellowship.

GrouPeru! '14: We are preparing for a season of fund-raisers to send off a group of young adult, and adult missionaries from FPC and the metro area to once again return to help the rescued street boys of Peru. We will leave the middle of June and return by the end of June (2 full weeks). Now is the time to make a commitment and begin to lower the price that you will pay out-of-pocket. Come experience rice and chicken (daily), cold showers, shanty town water hand-out, hard labor, daily devotions, trash river, international/hometown relationships, and Jesus, all rolled into an experience that will change your life forever!

'13 Team and Laura for cooking and serving on Sunday. What a blessing this family of faith is!

Student and Discipleship Ministries Report

We, the Church, are the temple of God. I've been keenly aware lately of how God has shown himself strong by bringing unity in First Presbyterian's fellowship and maturity in the students' lives. After two years of being the director of student ministries, it is so exciting to see lives transformed by Jesus! Each week, month and year more "living stones" are added to our spiritual house as we grow in Christ. The summer season has been fruitful with VBS, 5Days Camp, Laura and I getting married, and growing small groups for the young adults. All this leaves me expectant for God to move powerfully in the 2013-14 school year! So what's next?

We have a tight-knit group of high school seniors that are preparing to leave for college next year. I will meet with them for group discipleship to make sure they're ready for the college life. Please pray specifically for the seniors to experience God in their devotional lives this year. It is by experiencing Jesus personally that they will prioritize their faith as adults.

The 6th-10th grade students will again meet on a weekly basis for games, Bible discussion, and hands-on activities to help them truly become brothers and sisters in Christ. Older students will have opportunities to lead small group discussions and activities to grow in leadership capabilities and confidence in their faith. We are also planning a fall lock-in and other special events for the students to bond and grow spiritually. Please pray that the 6th-10th grade students feel at home in youth group and recognize their identities as loved children of God!

We currently have five small groups for young adults in addition to the Saturday night Converge program. These include Bible study, prayer, worship, and fellowship in different forms to meet their needs. Praise God for the growth and relationships that have formed over the past year and a half! Please pray for the leaders who disciple their peers as they follow Christ together. Many young adults need prayer for employment, life direction, confidence in their faith, and a solid relationship with the rest of their home church.

I encourage you to look for ways to connect with the youth and young adults in your life. We have a generation in need of spiritual mothers, fathers and "older cousins" to walk with them in becoming men and women of God. As we prayerfully serve together as a church family we will truly be "built together to become a dwelling in which God lives by his Spirit." – Ephesians 2:22

You shall not covet... anything that belongs to your neighbor.

Exodus 20:17; Deut. 5:21

These texts list house, wife, servants, animals, and “anything that belongs to your neighbor.” The Exodus version emphasizes house, (which could mean household), while the Deuteronomy version emphasizes wife and the “setting of your desire.”

Obedying the Tenth Commandment protects us from many sins. It does not deal with specific acts, but it restrains our sinful hearts (*Matt 15:19*) which lead us into sinful acts (*James 1:14, 15*). Jesus emphasizes this in the Sermon on the Mount where He condemns our sinful desires (*Matt 5:21-23; 27-28*).

Coveting displays our dissatisfaction with God’s provision. It focuses our envy onto what our neighbor possesses, so we resent God’s grace to our neighbor while forgetting God’s grace to us. Thus we tend to resent our neighbor (whom we are to love) and his good fortune. This can lead us to sin against our neighbor, doing such things as hatred, murder, adultery, stealing, and lying (Commandments 6, 7, 8, and 9). Coveting feeds our selfishness which weakens our spiritual life. Covetous people break God’s Commandments to satisfy their covetous desires. Coveting exposes sin. Paul saw his own sin in his tendency to covet (*Rom. 7:7-13*). He learned to be content in all circumstances (*Phil 4:11, 12*).

We are called to love our neighbor (*Matt. 22:37-40*). Covetousness makes that very difficult; to love, we must be born again (*John 3:3 - 7*) and become new people in Christ (*2 Cor. 5:17, 21*).

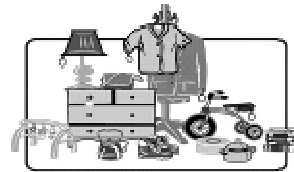

Emergency Response Plan Task Force

The Emergency Response Plan Task Force has completed the first draft of a plan to make our facility a safe and secure environment for worship and ministry.

We have enhanced our building and personnel security with classroom bolts, and office windows. Curtains for inside classroom windows are on a "hoped for" list as funds become available. Establishing procedures and timeframes for doors to be locked during various activities (thereby limiting access to the whole building) is in progress.

Chris Mayer is being trained as a "trainer" in CPR and first aid so she can hold training events here at the church periodically, keeping our knowledge and skills up to date. Training events will be held this fall. More information to come.

We are creating a panic/alert system for usage between the ushers and children's leaders on Sundays, and between the office, staff, daytime user groups and Treasure Chest during the week

Evacuation signs are being created and posted for each room in the building that will direct people how best to evacuate the room (assuming the fire/smoke/problem is not in their way) and where to assemble outside. These should be in place this month.

We will hold specific training for all the ushers as we have increased their responsibilities for emergency response.

We will hold an all-church fire drill on Sunday, Sept. 15th at the end of worship to practice our evacuation plan for the whole building and to help our ushers, children's leaders, parents, and worship attendees know what to do and where to go safely.

We will ask each user group in the church in Sept. to give us 15 minutes of their meeting time in order for us to share those portions of the Emergency Response Plan that apply to their group.
