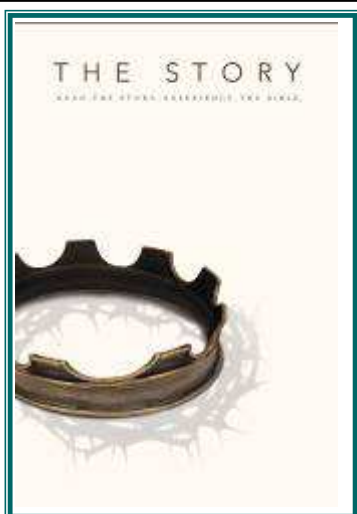

Veterans Day Sunday, November 11th

Veterans Day is an official United States holiday honoring armed services veterans. It is a federal holiday that is observed on November 11. It coincides with other holidays such as Armistice Day or Remembrance Day, which are celebrated in other parts of the world and also mark the anniversary of the signing of the Armistice that ended World War

I. (Major hostilities of World War I were formally ended at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918 with the German signing of the Armistice.)

Veterans Day celebrates the service of all U.S. military veterans, while Memorial Day is a day of remembering the men and women who *died* while serving.



Reflection on Stewardship

Our Stewardship theme for this year is **Responding to God's Love** based on Romans 8:28: *"And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose."* This is a profound concept that tells us that God helps those who love him *and* support his plan. We see many examples of this throughout the Bible where those who love God and share gratefully continue to be blessed by God, and prosper.

We have so much to be thankful for: some of God's work is easy to see in our daily lives: children learning, souls saved through mission work and compassion provided to those in need to name only a few. But frequently it is easy to take God's work for granted because much of His work was accomplished generations before we were born, and taken for granted since the results have "always" existed. The work was done by others, and never really understood or appreciated.

Only when we take stock in all that has been provided throughout our lives, and the opportunities afforded to us, can we begin to comprehend all that has been provided to us throughout our lives. Out of profound gratitude we know God's love for us.

As stewards of God's gifts to us, we need to do what He calls each of us to accomplish in support of His plan. For everyone has gifts that can be used to glorify God and finding your fit within the church allows you to team-up with groups enabling you to leverage your gifts. Plans and programs will come to life and fulfill God's plans with your help. There is much work to be done; ask God how you should devote your stewardship of love, and listen for what He calls you to achieve!

Musings from Pastor Mike

Pastoral Duties: I am working with Bob Brinton and Pastor Dave on putting together a Leadership Conference in early February that will be held here at First Church Dearborn. My part in particular was to line up two young adults who could film, edit, and present some of the “best practices” for growing worship attendance. I am happy to announce that Chris Masouredis and Ralph Evangelista will be our sound and camera/producer film artists & technicians. I am extremely blessed that *Converge* will be featured as one of the components of the Presbytery of Detroit Leadership Conference demonstrating how this program has brought a number of young adults to Saturday evening worship at the young adult gathering each week, as well as boosted Sunday morning worship and participation. I am continuing to counsel/disciple 10 young men on individual basis as well as host a Wednesday evening young adult Bible study each week at *FISH*.

Young Adult Ministries: *Converge* continues to attract and involve new young adults each month. Even with a number of young adults returning to college life away from home, new young adults who are going to school in the area or working are finding *Converge* to be their gathering place of choice. Currently, 2 classes are being taught on Moslems and Christianity (how to comfortably present your faith to a follower of Islam). One class is a lecture/discussion class taught by Adam and the other is a video/discussion class taught by myself. Both classes are reviewing what we believe as followers of Jesus Christ and helping us all to become firmly grounded in explaining our faith to others. As you read this edition of *The Vision*, 7 or more of the young adults and I will be in Joplin, Missouri on a Presbytery of Detroit Disaster relief Trip. Please keep us in prayer as we travel and work to help in rebuilding after a disastrous tornado hit that area a year ago. Later this month a number of young adults and I will also be volunteering at DRMM’s Soup Kitchen to help feed the hungry.]]

GrouPeru! ’13: We are currently signing up high school, college-age, young adults, and adults (younger kids with an accompanying parent are welcome as well) for another mission trip to Peru. Our on-going relationship with the rescued street boys is such a blessing to them, us, and our family of faith. Since I have also been working closely with the Presbytery of Detroit’s chairperson of the “Hands-on Mission” committee, we may open the trip up to all the Presbyterian churches in the metro area. Our goal is to have a team of 15 to be able to do construction, witness, and love on these abandoned boys.

Notes from our Parish Nurse

“10 warning signs of Alzheimer’s”

Alzheimer's disease is a progressive, degenerative disorder that attacks the brain's nerve cells, or neurons, resulting in loss of memory, thinking and language skills, and behavioral changes. There are many “typical” changes that happen as we age, but there are others that may alert us to health problems. If you read these “warning signs” and see a pattern occurring in yourself or loved one, please discuss it with your physician.

- 1. Memory loss that disrupts daily life** One of the most common signs of Alzheimer's is memory loss, especially forgetting recently learned information. Others include forgetting important dates or events; asking for the same information over and over; relying on memory aides (e.g., reminder notes or electronic devices) or family members for things they used to handle on their own. *What's typical? Sometimes forgetting names or appointments, but remembering them later.*
- 2. Challenges in planning or solving problems** Some people may experience changes in their ability to develop and follow a plan or work with numbers. They may have trouble following a familiar recipe or keeping track of monthly bills. They may have difficulty concentrating and take much longer to do things than they did before. *What's typical? Making occasional errors when balancing a checkbook.*
- 3. Difficulty completing familiar tasks at home, at work or at leisure** People with Alzheimer's often find it hard to complete daily tasks. Sometimes, people may have trouble driving to a familiar location, managing a budget at work or remembering the rules of a favorite game. *What's typical? Occasionally needing help to use the settings on a microwave or to record a television show.*
- 4. Confusion with time or place** People with Alzheimer's can lose track of dates, seasons and the passage of time. They may have trouble understanding something if it is not happening immediately. Sometimes they may forget where they are or how they got there. *What's typical? Getting confused about the day of the week but figuring it out later.*
- 5. Trouble understanding visual images and spatial relationships.** For some people, having vision problems is a sign of Alzheimer's. They may have difficulty reading, judging distance and determining color or contrast. In terms of perception, they may pass a mirror and think someone else is in the room. They may not realize they are the person in the mirror. *What's typical? Vision changes related to cataracts*
- 6. New problems with words in speaking or writing.** People with Alzheimer's may have trouble following or joining a conversation. They may stop in the middle of a conversation and have no idea how to continue or they may repeat themselves. They may struggle with vocabulary, have problems finding the right word or call things by the wrong name (e.g., calling a "watch" a "hand-clock"). *What's typical? Sometimes having trouble finding the right word*
- 7. Misplacing things and losing the ability to retrace steps.** A person with Alzheimer's disease may put things in unusual places. They may lose things and be unable to go back over their steps to find them again. Sometimes, they may accuse others of stealing. This may occur more frequently over time. *What's typical? Misplacing things from time to time, such as a pair of glasses or the remote control*
- 8. Decreased or poor judgment.** People with Alzheimer's may experience changes in judgment or decision-making. For example, they may use poor judgment when dealing with money, giving large amounts to telemarketers. They may pay less attention to grooming or keeping themselves clean. *What's typical? Making a bad decision once in a while.*
- 9. Withdrawal from work or social activities.** A person with Alzheimer's may start to remove themselves from hobbies, social activities, work projects or sports. They may have trouble keeping up with a favorite sports team or remembering how to complete a favorite hobby. They may also avoid being social because of the changes they have experienced. *What's typical? Sometimes feeling weary of work, family and social obligations.*
- 10. Changes in mood and personality.** The mood and personalities of people with Alzheimer's can change. They can become confused, suspicious, depressed, fearful or anxious. They may be easily upset at home, at work, with friends or in places where they are out of their comfort zone. *What's typical? Developing very specific ways of doing things and becoming irritable when a routine is disrupted*

For those who have suffered a loss or who are going through a difficult time, life can be filled with painful loneliness and emptiness.
