“being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus.” *Philippians 1:6*

This verse includes Paul’s faith in Christ, God’s salvation in Christ, our sanctification in Christ, our security in Christ, and our glorification with Christ.

First, Paul trusts God’s faithfulness to finish the salvation that He begins. Salvation begins and is completed by God (*Romans 8:28-30*). Thus, sinners are saved by grace, not merit, preventing human pride (*Ephesians 2:8, 9*). We must only respond by faith (*John 1:12*), which God’s Spirit enables (*1 Corinthians 12:3*). All is of God!

The “good work” He completes in us is our sanctification (*Philippians 2:12, 13*) where we work out our salvation with fear and trembling as God works out His good purposes in us. This conforms us to Christ’s image (*Romans 8:29*), which makes our bodies living sacrifices so our lives can be acts of worship (*Romans 12:1*).

The fact that God completes in us what He starts secures our salvation – The saints persevere because God perseveres in them, another act of grace to overcome our sin. That is why our faith is in God and not ourselves (*John 6:40, 44; John 10:28, 29; Romans 8:38, 39; Ephesians 1:13, 14; Hebrews 7:25; Luke 15:11-31*).

All this leads to our glorification in Christ’s presence – either when we die and go to Him **or** when He returns for us (*1 Thessalonians 4:16-18; 5:9; Hebrews 9:27, 10:14; 2 Peter 3:10-13; Jude 24*).

May you rest in the peace of God (*Romans 5:1*) who loves you and is restoring His image in you.

And that night they had the choir sing it for the first time with only guitar accompaniment, since the organ had broken down. Manage Holiday Stress—Don't Let Stress Manage You

The holidays are upon us and there is much to be thankful for and to celebrate. However, few people recognize that this is also a time of greater expectations and stress for many people. So here are a few tips to help make this season more enjoyable and healthy.

- **Keep expectations for the season realistic;** therefore, set goals that are reasonable for you. Before beginning a task, make a list and prioritize the important activities.
- **Recognize your own limitations and don't over-do it.** There is no need to attend every social gathering or to create the perfect social event.
- **Learn to delegate the holiday chores.** It is not necessary to try to do everything by yourself.
- **Know your spending limit and stay on budget.** With today's economy and cutbacks, it is important to respect one's financial limitations.
- **Take a time out. After completing a holiday task,** take time to relax and make sure to get enough rest.
- **Remember to eat healthy, nutritious food,** as you would do any other time of the year. Also, drink plenty of water and juices. Maintaining a healthy diet will help support your immune system, reduce fatigue, and fight illness.
- **Try to maintain an exercise routine.** Researchers have found that exercise is an excellent treatment to alleviate depression.
- **The holiday season does not mean that you will not have difficult feelings.** It is important to acknowledge one's feelings, even if you keep them to yourself.
- **Try to look to the future with an optimistic perspective** despite difficulties of the past. Find ways to see the good in challenging experiences.
- **Participate in holiday activities that are free and light-hearted.** Plan to attend festive activities that do not require large amounts of travel time.
- **Volunteer for a charitable organization(s)** that reach out to the needy, or contribute to community food drives in your neighborhood.
- **Spend time with supportive and caring friends and/or family,** if possible. Yet, should you find yourself alone, then be certain to schedule enjoyable activities into your free time.

In conclusion, try a little laughter. Research psychologists have found that humor improves one's sense of overall well being. And sometimes it is necessary to ask for assistance in order to get through difficult times.

I never lost my faith, however, and hope in the Lord even though I’m homeless and feel hopeless and helpless.

I have prayed and tried my hardest at everything I did, but got lost somewhere along the way. I still pray with all my heart and soul for the Lord’s guidance in helping me find a way back.

You all opened your church and families to us homeless people, and I thank all of you from the bottom of my heart. Since this is only a 30 day program, I am thinking about enlisting in the armed forces to try to better myself.

I am just a homeless man with nothing. I will remember all the kindness you have shown us while here, and I ask that you can find it in your hearts to pray for us and myself in the choice and endeavor I’m about to take in the steps to better my life. Thank you for all your kindness and support.
