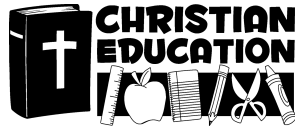

On July 17th, the Vacation Bible School (Shake it Up Café) will help lead us in worship. We hope to have some café treats for our fellowship following the service.

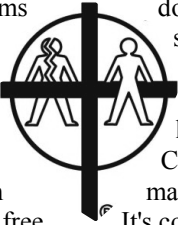

INTERIM 2011 FINANCIAL STATUS



On May 17th the Finance Committee reviewed the Church’s Operating results for the first four months of the year. It shows a \$27,990 deficit Year-To-Date, which is consistent with the forecasted \$43,000 twelve month deficit included in this year’s budget. After the costly impact of the cold and snowy winter, our operating expenses have run below budgeted amounts; and contributed income has held at levels consistent with expectations. Our committees and staff are demonstrating effective discipline in regard to operating costs.

The Finance Committee requests members, who are expecting to travel out of town for some of the forthcoming summer months, to continue their normal pledge payments to the church during that period.

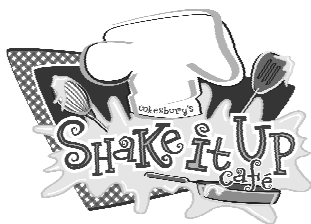

June is National Safety Awareness Week

June is a month to focus on safety awareness, and I would like to share some statistics and information, if implemented, can lead to greater safety behind the wheel. The two areas I want to focus on today are the use of cell phones while driving and requiring more strict standards for new teen drivers.

On the Road, Off the Phone

Nearly 1 out of every 4 motor vehicle crashes involve cell phone use. While 62% of drivers recognize that talking on a cell phone is a very serious threat to their personal safety, more than 2 out of every 3 drivers admit to talking on their cell phone in the past month.

Why The Disconnect?

It's important to understand the three main kinds of distraction:

1. **Visual:** Eyes on road
2. **Mechanical:** Hands on wheel
3. **Cognitive:** Mind on driving

Safe driving is about more than hands on the wheel and eyes on the road – it's about *focusing solely on the task of driving*. When drivers engage in two activities that require a great amount of mental focus, the brain quickly switches between those tasks sequentially. As a result, the brain suffers from *inattention blindness*. As it switches its focus and attention back and forth, the brain loses its ability to process all the eyes see and only a portion of the information is captured. In this situation, drivers look out the windshield, **but do not see up to 50% of the driving environment**. In fact, the brain is so overloaded that not all critical driving cues such as red lights, stop signs and pedestrians are delivered to the brain. Even hands-free talking on the phone is a big distraction, but the physical distraction is eliminated.

Teen Driving can be risky business

Drivers between the ages of 15 and 20 are involved in fatal crashes, at more than twice the rate as the rest of the population. One of the most effective methods proven to reduce teen crash risk by up to 40% is Graduated Driver Licensing (GDL). Since inexperience is a leading factor in traffic crashes involving young adults, Graduated Driver Licensing (GDL) makes good sense. Based on more than a decade of research, GDL ensures young drivers accumulate driving experience under controlled circumstances. Each step in the process includes certain restrictions tied to the permit. *What makes GDL beneficial for parents is that while GDL may or may not be a state law, it can be a law in the home.* Below is a list of components that make up best practices in GDL. These are effective guidelines parents should enforce include when their young adult is learning to drive:

- ◆ Zero tolerance for drugs and alcohol
- ◆ Never use a cell phone –hands held or hands free - while driving
- ◆ Zero passengers under age 18 until driver is age 18
- ◆ Seat belts are to be worn by all passengers at all times
- ◆ Nighttime driving limits – no driving after 10:00 p.m. for the first six months

Making some changes in these two areas (and sharing this information with others) may possibly lead to saving lives. You are important to us, drive safely.

If you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from his love, if any fellowship with the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion, 2 then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and purpose. 3 Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but in humility consider others better than yourselves. 4 Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of others. *Philippians 2:1-4*

“A household divided against itself will not stand” (*Matt. 12:25*). Unity among Christians is essential and based on four factors: 1) being “in Christ,” 2) experiencing and sharing Christ’s love, 3) having fellowship by the same Spirit, and 4) compassion. Mature Christians are to become like-minded and live by the same love, Spirit, and purpose. Our Christian unity also increases our pastors’ joy because they care so deeply for us.

Verse 3 notes three causes of disunity we should avoid: selfish ambition, conceit (seeking prestige), and an overemphasis on self that

disregards others. These are part of our sin nature from which we are repenting and replacing with humility (*verse 3, Luke 14:11; Rom 12:10; Eph 5:21*) and a loving concern for others (*verse 4, Gal 6:2; John 13:34, 35*). To do so, at least three steps are needed:

1. Admit that by nature we don’t like other people and we prefer pride to humility. Before we can become humble, we must acknowledge that we are proud.
2. Humble ourselves before God, admitting our unworthiness in His eyes (*Ex 3:4-6; Job 42:6; Isa 6:5; Luke 5:8; 1 Peter 5:5, 6*). Remember, in the end, Christians will be in His Presence joyfully and without flaw (*Jude 24*).
3. Spend time with our Lord and Savior, the source of our new lives (*John 1:4, 9, 12, 13, 17, 18; 6:53; 15:4-6; Philippians 4:13*). Do so through prayer (*Luke 18:1; Matt 7:7-10*), Bible study (*Rom 10:17; 2 Tim 3:16, 17*), meditation (*Psalms 1:1-3; 119:11*) and obedience (*Matt 28:18-20; Luke 6:46; John 7:17; 14:15, 21; 15:10*).

PENTECOST MOBILE

Make this craft as a reminder that God's Holy Spirit is all around you.

What you need:

- Tissue paper (red, yellow, orange), torn into squares
- Plastic transparency
- Craft glue
- Paintbrush
- Construction paper
- Black marker
- Wire hanger
- White copy paper
- Scissors
- Pencil
- Hole punch
- Fishing line

What you do:

1. Overlap tissue squares as "flames" on the transparency.
2. "Paint" glue (thinned with water) over the squares.
3. Fold construction paper in half. Write out Acts 2:4 at the top, by the fold.
4. Poke the hanger through the middle of the fold.
5. On the white paper, write "Holy Spirit" in English, Spanish (*Espiritu Santo*), French (*L'esprit Saint*), etc.
6. Cut out a flame pattern and trace it on the back of the transparency.
7. Cut out flames and glue the "Holy Spirit" names on them.
8. Thread fishing line through a hole atop each flame and tie flames onto the hanger.


